

I have also found more Ex members, the great Jazz musician Adam Glasser(page8) and Francis Thurmer (page9).



On C4 there is currently a series of programmes (Grand Designs House of the Year) showing different styles of architecturally designed houses with a view to the RIBA (Royal Institute of British Architectures) voting from a final short list of houses featured in the programme. The winning house will be declared "House of the Year"

In the episode aired on Wednesday 24th November there was a house featured that was called "The Slot House". It was given this name because it was literally "slotted" into a space that was once a disused alley. The width of alley was just 2.80 metres so it really was a case of slotting the house into

the very narrow space available. Anyway, Claire and I watched the programme and as the film started showing external details of the house Claire commented that the house immediately to the right of the "Slot House" actually looked a bit familiar. The more that the programme showed external details the more convinced Claire became that she was certain that she knew the house immediately to the right.

AFRICAN LETTER 2021

Fifty years ago last month (5th November 1971) we embarked on the Windsor Castle from Southampton seen off by Roy & Gina Savery to forge a new life in Sunny South Africa, a Land of Milk and Honey

One Dollar would buy you R1.3/4

One Pound sterling would buy you R 1.77

Petrol was under 9 cents a litre

A Mercedes would cost you R4000

A three bedroom house under R20000

You decided how much you were going to save before you went shopping

And now fifty years later sunny South Africa is but a Land of Dust and Ashes

One Dollar buys you R16

A Pound buys you R22

Petrol R19 per litre

A Mercedes will cost you R850 000

A three bedroom house (little change from One Million Rand

After you go shopping you decide how much to save if you have any left

Crime is rampant, house breakins with armed robbers commonplace; living in Gated Complexes almost a must, especially for the elderly (which includes us these days!).

Hi jacking a daily occurrence.

Most of these activities carry little in the Newspapers as they are almost daily activities.

In June our former President Jacob Zuma, was sentenced to 15 months for contempt of court and boy did we have fun over the following few months until he was released on Medical Parole. Shops burnt down, looting was rife, large multi stores in shopping centres were severely damaged that it took several months to repair and replace stock before they could reopen, which happened only last week. An area called Springfield Park was almost flattened. Police warned us via East Coast Radio not to approach anywhere the area. Some mobs clashed with the police resulting in the usual gun battles. Several Africans were killed bringing the usual uproar of police brutality.

Several people have been charged with inciting riots

Lorry drivers are on permanent quarrel to ban foreign drivers and recently blocked the main road to Johannesburg in both directions, lorries blocking all six lanes: three up and two down. This started at 3am, so when the daily traffic started you can imagine the commotion! The road was finally opened later the same day.

Taxi wars are ongoing, not with the drivers but with the Owners squabbling over the routes used, resulting in muliple drive-by shootings,

Local municipal elections were held recently, resulting in several candidates from townships finding themselves in gun battles with opposing parties. Three women dressed in ANC t-shirts were killed as they attempted to visit a political party meeting.

After Rio, where we gained 10 medals in the Olympics, and 17 medals in the Para-Olympics we thought we would have even greater success in Tokyo this year. Unfortunately this did not happen and we were restricted to just 3 medals in the Olympics (2 swimming and 1 Surfing) and 7 in the Para-Olympics. Our hero was 19 year old double amputee Ntando Mahlango, who spent the first 10 years of his life in a wheelchair. At 14 he had won a Silver Medal in Rio, prior to winning double gold in both the 100m and the Long Jump in Tokyo.

Have you noticed as you get a little older each year how many friends don't make it? We have seen 7 friends and acquaintances between the ages of 55 and 83 pass on this year: three from cancer; three for stroke and heart attacks, and one shot at home by masked robbers.

Life can be so short for some, but for us it lingers around a bit!

Both Judi and I had Covid 19 in August: I was in hospital for a week while Judi suffered at home. Two months later I went to the gym to train and landed back in hospital for another 2 days'

After 4 and ½ months we are still showing signs of the aftermath

With the New Year approaching new us!!!!!!!!!!

Another Clubman Killed.

We regret to record the death in France of Frank C. Reed (Queen's Westminsters), a popular member of the De Laune C.C. Previously C. Maxwell and P. Williams, of the same club had been wounded, and while the latter was having his wounds dressed a shell entered the building and caused further casualties. Frank Reed deprived himself of all rest that night by assisting to bandage and carry the wounded to the dressing station, as there was a lack of R.A.M.C. stretcher bearers. Next day, while in the reserve trenches, a shell burst near him, and a portion of shrapnel entered his head and killed him. His loss is a severe blow to his club, of which he was one of the most active members. A good rider, he had also a wonderful gift of thrilling his audiences with his songs, and he delighted the men of his regiment at the occasional concerts held in the rear of the trenches. Clubdom will mourn his loss.


I left at 4am again, enjoying the cool morning and another brilliant sunrise. Breakfast in St Arnaud where I caught up with Rich and Noel again, then off on my own to tackle the inevitable. It was as bad as I remembered and with my fatigue and sore knee I had to walk a lot. But it was fine. I just got on with it and it wasn't really a big deal. I enjoyed the downs, making use of my mountain biking background. Until.... BANG! As soon as it happened I reacted quickly! A rock had sliced my sidewall. I was off the bike, finger over the gash while I ripped out my plugs from my top tube bag and stuffed one in there. It sealed OK and due to my quick reaction I hadn't lost much air, but I couldn't get it to seal completely so it was a slow leak the rest of the way to the finish line, stopping every few hours to add more air.

Once past the climbing I relaxed, knowing for sure

now that I would get to the end. The remainder of the day from Avoca to Creswick was the section of the route which I put together. Familiar territory I'd ridden heaps of times. I was surprised how much harder everything was than every other time I've ridden it! Fatigue made all those small climbs HURT! But I was having a great time

BENCHES AT NEWNHAM

In last month's DLN (December 2021) there was a photograph of one of the two benches that the club has donated to the Church of St Peter and St Paul at Newnham. One of the benches is dedicated to Sir Roger Moate (1938-2019). Sir Roger was the Conservative MP for Faversham, Kent from 1970 to 1997; he was a member of the Select Committee for Agriculture from 1995 to 1997 and was knighted in 1993. He moved back to Faversham from Newnham, where he died of cancer in 2019.

The second bench is dedicated to Charlie Clark (1923-2020), who moved to Newnham from Bromley, Kent just before the Second World War. Charlie worked as a farmhand on a local farm where there were some thirty other employees. Today the farm is owned by an insurance company who employ just a farm manager with no other employees, all the farm work such as ploughing, seeding and harvesting is carried out by sub-contractors.

It is interesting to note that Sir Roger Moate and Charlie Clark should meet as Church Wardens at St Peter and St Paul Church from opposite ends of the agricultural industry.
