

## BRIAN (TITCH) SHAMBROOK

Brian sadly died on the 5th April this year but, due to the pandemic, his memorial service and the scattering of his ashes had to be delayed; this was finally held on Wednesday, 11th November at Dedham Parish Church.

About a dozen people attended, including Brian's two nephews, Gary and Kevin and their partners, a few neighbours, together with Mike Peel and Terri, Roy Savery, Bill Wright and myself representing the club.

As we entered the church Roy asked me who was going to give the eulogy. I replied that I thought he was! He sat down in the pew and in the time it took for the recording of the hymn Jerusalem to be played he had compiled a few words of tribute to Brian. Roy saved the day as it was entirely my fault that I had not requested him to do this in sufficient time for him to be appropriately prepared.

After a short service, we then went outside for the scattering of Brian's ashes. The vicar said a few words followed by a prayer, and Gary lowered the urn containing Brian's ashes into a very neat, square-foot hole cut into the grass - and that was farewell to Brian. Sadly, the village was, of course, in lockdown so we were unable to join Gary and Kevin for a meal or a drink. We had, however, taken the opportunity to drink to Brian's memory whilst in Yorkshire in October on one of Mike's HF walking holidays. A number of members of the De Laune and Blackheath Harriers met one evening in the lounge of the mansion we were staying at and raised a glass to Brian. (Brian had paid his deposit for this holiday and should have been with us!)

As I drove home along the A12 - the most boring of roads - it crossed my mind that Brian had taken this same route countless times on his many trips to London and Kent (in fact, I hold him partly responsible for the extremely poor road surface!).

Although he was always in the background, Brian will be missed for his good humour and ready wit. If I were to be asked to suggest some wording for his gravestone, I would choose a quote from Abraham Lincoln: "I am very little inclined on any occasion to say anything unless I hope to produce some good by it".
