What a year! Even South Africa has been on lookdown, but like the UK many do not accept the importance of the necessary protection.

But what is new, I could fill the whole De Laune news with the happenings in this Country. Do you really want to know what it is like over here? 77 policemen killed on duty 87 taxi related incidents (manly owners) resulting in deaths in Western Cape alone 700 people killed in taxi accidents on the road. In KZN the old Natal saw four taxi accidents that have a death of more than 50 passengers.

One rolled down an embankment after running out of road, one was crushed between two lorries, and two were head on collision.

Taxis are licensed to carry 12 passengers but most carry between 16 and up to 25.

More than 50 farmers attacked and murdered during 2020. That's just the start.

Corruption is so out of control and that's another story: A police Brigadier and many of her ranked officers below her were involved in a tender for the painting of police vehicles. The company who won the tender was owned by her husband? A Colonel and other officers were involved in gun sales from their headquarters. There are so many others reported daily in the newspaper but too many to mention.

An African bank has gone under. At the beginning of the year it was noticed that Jacob Zuma, our past President had taken a loan of R7million to update his swimming pool and auditorium. Months later when the bank got into difficulties, all the directors, from the Chairman and CEO down had also taken loans. And bang went the bank. The case has yet to come to court.

The Durban City mayor was relieved of her duties in 2019 on account of a R200m fraud in a Waste Disposal scheme. Now she and her City Councillors have managed to increase the fraud to R400m. The case has yet to come to Court.

And now something to bring a smile to your face.....

For years we lived in a house on 1400m2 of land on a corner plot with two road frontages, and very vulnerable position. With so many house break ins and robberies Judi was always suggesting that we sell and move to a retirement complex for more safety. He collected four pints of Guinness and six cans of export ale at the presentation in the Smarden Bell pub, which was packed with more specta-

tors than riders.

There were only 40 of the latter, although the club expect a bumper

turn-out next year having missed the handbook for the last two seasons.

Second man home Kevin Hickman, now in the VC St Raphael, was only three seconds - and the odd minute - down on Smith and won six cans of Long Life, while Southborough's own Val Peachey, the slowest rider with a restful 36-11, received a packet of prunes. Fastest woman was Jean Smith, another Southborough stalwart, who did 31-43.
