Ernest Stafford Carlos (1883–1917) was a British painter and war artist.



He is best known for his works depicting the early days of the Scout Movement. He joined the British Army and was killed during the First World War.

Born on 4 June 1883. He was educated at St John the Divine School in Kennington and the Lambeth School of Art, gaining a scholarship to study at the Royal Academy Schools in 1901. He had a painting displayed at the Royal Academy summer exhibition when he was seventeen years of age and had a further thirteen works displayed in later summer exhibitions during his career, the last being in

1915. Around 1904 Carlos set up a studio in the family home at

Foxley Road, north Brixton, from where he built up a business painting and copying portraits, often of senior clergymen. During his time in Brixton, he became interested in efforts to improve the conditions of the urban poor. His painting of an unemployed man. A print of the original painting by Ernest Carlos, who also




founded the 107th London Troop, which today is known as the 21st Camberwell (trinity) Scout Group. It was painted in 1913 and given to Lord Baden-Powell by the artist. The boy who posed for the painting was Percy Greaves, a local choir boy. The original copy hangs in the Baerlein Room in The White House at Gilwell Park. It has been reproduced as a stained glass window in several churches. A print has also appeared on the wall of Ken Barlow's living room in Coronation Street.

This has been in an earlier DLN but for those who have not seen it the painting of Alured Faunce de Laune, which was over 7 feet tall was presented to the club in 1964 by Mrs Faunce de Laune we had to have it cut down so that it could be hung on a wall at the club room.
