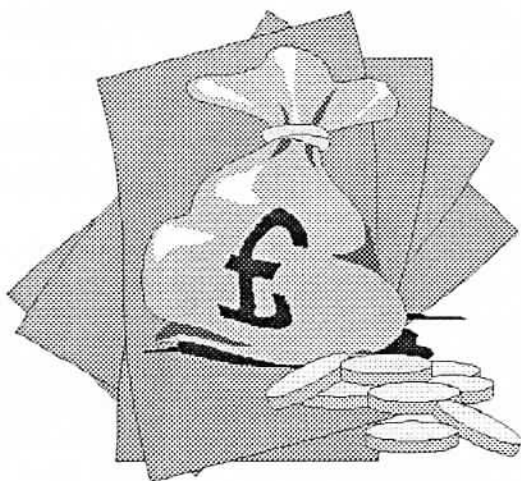

At one time there were always monthly articles from the secretaries giving up-to-date results of riders. There were reports on events and Club runs, whilst any important decisions by the Committee were published. The chitchat of old members was confined to a "pink" page. It was a complete hotchpotch with something of interest to all, but to a great extent we now rely on our President keeping us informed.

The editor can only publish the articles received, and we must face the fact the DLN has degenerated into an Old Members magazine. Cannot efforts be made to broaden its appeal by persuading officials and riders to contribute? It would not take long to put pen to paper, which I am sure, would be welcome and maybe even increase support for events.

I agree with Mark Ballamy that the proposed change in the format of the DLN would be disastrous. Other than a dozen or so riders and a similar number of officials a news sheet would be of no particular interest to the general membership and hardly compensated by an issue every six months. It would be a disappointment to many whom through age, distance, or whatever, only contact with the Club is through the DLN and would test their continued allegiance to the full.

I read with dismay 32 members were recently written off, which continues the trend over recent years. Once they are lost they seldom re-join. The New Year's resolution of the Committee should be to give priority in retaining members and increase the numbers where possible for it is on this the strength of the Club depends. Tampering with the DLN will not help.

I realise it is not always easy in finding a new Editor, but on several occasions previously this problem has been overcome by forming a small sub-committee. The editor being responsible for collating copy and chasing for articles, another responsible for production - and with all the modern forms of communication, e-mail, floppy discs, etc. This should not be too difficult - and yet another dealing with distribution. Perhaps this could be the solution.

But on this occasion persistence and regular racing were beginning to bear fruit. He judged his move perfectly sprinting off the front at just the right distance from the end. He crossed the line in first position far ahead of the others... so far ahead that he was in the showers by the time the bunch rolled in exhausted (Actually ..err.. I maybe exaggerating - call it journalistic licence).

Seriously though it was a pleasure to see these good rides. Let's hope 2000 will provide thrill with no spills for all on two wheels.

1920's

At the end of last year the Club received a couple of enquiries which were passed on to me by Katie. One was from a member of the Twickenham CC, Mike Cater, who is collecting "cycling club and all associated cycling associations and governing bodies' cloth badges". Dot Fuller passed a couple of our badges on to me and I sent them on to Mr. Cater; to date we have not received any acknowledgement of receipt or thanks.

The other enquiry was from a Beryl Smith, who lives in Scarborough, Yorkshire, and is anxious to trace the cycling club of which her late father, Sidney Smith, had been a member in the 1920s. He had lived in the East Dulwich area. The BCF sent her a list of clubs in southeast London, thus her enquiries were directed to us.

I have waded through our archives and although we have several Smiths, alas no S Smith. I explained that between the last issue of the Budget in April 1919 (I sent her a copy of the Club History so that she would know what the Budgets were) and the first issue of the De Laune News in January 1929 all mention of De Laune activities were recorded in The Southern Cyclist magazine.

During the above period, one of our members had removed pages from The Southern Cyclist magazine in which the De Laune was mentioned. In these pages were write-ups on activities of other clubs who were affiliated to the SCCIJ. I sent photocopies of these pages for Beryl to browse through in case her father's name might have been mentioned. Alas, although she said how much she enjoyed reading the photocopies and our Club History, she could find nothing on her late father.

When photocopying these pages of The Southern Cyclist, it was interesting to note how many clubs have survived into the 21st century.

Accompanying this article are photocopies of two pages of The Southern Cyclist (see page 14 & 15) naming the clubs and listed below are the names of other clubs who were also affiliated to the SCCU at that time.
